Criminal law specialist **Michael L. Crowley** has been elected 2008 president of the **San Diego Criminal Defense Bar Association**. He takes over the leadership of the organization consisting of more than 200 public defenders and private attorneys who have devoted their careers to criminal defense. Besides **Crowley**, who takes over the presidency from public defender **Paul Rodriguez**, **Robert E. Boyce** has been elected v.p. and **Brian P. Funk**, recording secretary. The association membership also elected nine members to the board.

The organization, at its annual meeting recognized several members, including public defenders **Jack Hockman** as Trial Lawyer of the Year and **Linda Brown**, who received the Warhorse Defense award. Criminal defense attorneys **David Bartick** and **Mark Adams** were given a special director's award, and retired South Bay attorney **William M. McGuigan** was honored with a lifetime achievement award for his contributions to the criminal defense community.

In 2005, Crowley was honored as the Top Trial Lawyer by the San Diego Criminal Defense Bar Association along with colleagues Jerry Coughlan and Michael Pancer.

Crowley holds a bachelor's degree from the **University of South Florida** and a law degree from **California Western School of Law**. He started his legal career in 1984 as an associate in the law offices of current San Diego City Attorney **Michael Aguirre**. He has been a solo practitioner in the **Law Offices of Michael L. Crowley** since 1986.
